Tennis Bio Overview for Pam Lippy:

Pam is beginning her 10th year as the Director of Racquet Sports and Head Teaching Pro at the New Albany Links Country Club. She also teaches tennis at Olympic Indoor Tennis Club (2009 –present) and runs a “Future Stars” tennis program for preschool age children at 3 Columbus locations (2000-present). Pam is a certified United States Professional Teaching Association Elite Pro for the past 29 years.

Pam was the junior high boys’ and girls’ tennis coach at Columbus Academy from 1999-2008. Before that she began her Columbus coaching career at Columbus School for Girls Upper School. She also was the summer tennis director at CSG from 1998- 2015.

Pam was born and raised in Cleveland, Ohio. She started her professional career at her high school alma mater, Beachwood High School, where she coached the high school girls’ team and the 1st boys’ middle school team until she moved to New Albany in 1998. (1985-1998)

Pam continues to train and compete at the national level. Most recently competing in a USTA Level 1 Women’s National Clay Court Championship in Palm Beach Gardens, Florida, March 2022. Most recently, Pam joined the pickle ball circuit as a competitor and certified instructor.

Pam is a Flagler College, St. Augustine, Florida college graduate and 4 year scholarship tennis player as well as a 2 time All-American. She was inducted into the FC Athletic Hall of Fame in 2007.

She played her high school tennis at Beachwood High School and was the 1st woman to qualify for any state competition from there.

Pam is a devoted mother of Courtney, Carly, Harrison and Adam and a doting grandmother to Marleigh and Hayden. Courtney is an engineering graduate of Cleveland State University. Carly is a 4 year letter winner from NAHS varsity girls’ tennis team (2008) and a University of Cincinnati graduate. Harrison is a 4 year letter winner from NAHS varsity boys’ team (2016) and a 2020 graduate of Miami University of Oxford. Adam graduated NAHS Covid 2020 as 2 year varsity boys’ tennis player. All 3 players were 2 year members on the NAMS tennis teams. During this time, Pam was the NAMS tennis parent liaison for 6 years, most recently under Coach Oldenquist.
